Wellsprings Makes a Difference

Hope-springs.....

Hope-springs is a regular feature in our newsletter providing updates on present and former residents. To protect their privacy and maintain security, their names are not used.

"Mary T" came to Wellsprings under court recommendation and stayed for eight months. She came from the WHO-A program which is treatment in lieu of incarceration. While here, she attended onsite meetings, job search programs, court mandated meetings, and enrolled at Houston Community College. After diligently looking for work, she was successful. Miss T reunited with her family, after completing the court's requirement.

"Emily S" was at Wellsprings for about 5 months. She came as a result of being asked to move out by relatives. She attended onsite meetings, as well as job search programs. After job searching for a while, she obtained employment. She decided to move back with relatives since she is now able to contribute financially to the household.

ML is a current resident who has been at Wellsprings Village for three months. She left a domestic violence situation that had previously stifled her growth. She obtained employment at a local store chain and received a promotion in customer service within a month. She is receiving ongoing counseling to address her domestic violence issues. She also participates in life skills, conflict resolution, and peer group meetings. She is saving money and anticipates moving into her own apartment in the next six months.

Wellsprings is excited about the lineup of educational classes that recently began in May 2012. Working in conjunction with the Women's Resource Exchange, an eight week Money Smart financial education class began and is being facilitated by a volunteer financial professional. Additionally, several new extended series (12 – 14 weeks) began that included Anger Management for Women and Life Operating Principles. These classes are designed to teach critical life skills to the women that will assist them in becoming economically and emotionally self-sustaining. Women in recovery at Wellsprings continue to access weekly for Relapse Prevention and Sober Support. We are very grateful for Change Happens staff, Debra Veals and Albert Douglas who show up every week rain or shine to provide Wellsprings residents with job readiness and job search assistance. They have been extremely effective in helping unem-

ployed and underemployed residents obtain employment.

Wellsprings also added a Health and Wellness class during May that is being hosted each week by Dr. Brian Edward Horn. Dr. Horn was introduced and highly recommended to Wellsprings by Mary Cox, an active member of Wellsprings Guild. Dr. Horn is a Principled Chiropractor and is volunteering his services each week for the women. Dr. Horn provides valuable information to the women each week in order to enhance their ability to understand how their bodies should function when it is in balance. Dr. Horn's practice, Life Family Chiropractic, is located in Missouri City, Texas.

Kudos to our Executive Director

While working full time at Wellsprings Village, our intrepid Executive Director also was working to complete a masters degree. This past May, she received her Master of Science Degree in Addiction Counseling from Grand Canyon University.

Wellsprings provided the following for residents during 2011:

- 936 loads of laundry
- 3,999 bus rides
- 12,775 overnight stays
- 51,206 meals provided
- 7,425 van rides
- 972 personal items provided in Welcome Packs (packs contain toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, wash cloth, bath towel, lotion, shampoo, conditioner, soap)


Wellsprings spent \$4,310 on food from the Houston Food Bank....food was valued at \$40,940 which gives us an inkind value for the food of \$36,630. If you calculate what we *actually spent* (\$4,310) with the number of women served (135) it cost us .09 per day to feed each resident over the course of the year.

Wellsprings Village 2011 Annual Report

During this fiscal year we assisted 135 women, of which, one was in the 13-18 age group; 26 in the 19-26 age group; 57 were in the 27-45 age group; 50 were in the 46-59 age group and one was in the 60-64 age group.




2011 Ages of Residents

Of the 135 women served, 72 were African American; 57 were Caucasian; 2 Native American; 2 Asian/Pacific Islander and 2 Other.

Our expenses totaled \$663,059.30, with \$494,130.95 spent on program services; \$110,076.09 for administrative services; \$37,052.22 for fundraising

Our revenue sources totaled \$679,889.68. Foundations and corporations made up the largest portion with \$267,786.19. Next came government contracts of \$132,147.43. Individual donors contributed \$105,159.59. Our affiliation with United Way accounted for \$74,184.80. Wellsprings Guild's Annual Gala and other fundraising events brought in \$70,673.43. Churches donated \$8,861.74 and in-kind donations were valued at \$26,093.50

The Residents in 2011...

Wellsprings Village, Inc. served 135 women in the onsite transitional residence program. The residents were diverse in background, in culture, and in race, which included African-American, Caucasian, Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander, and Native American. Some stayed only a short time (a month to two months) and others needed a longer period of time (16 months).

Wellsprings offers the following services to its clients:

- Case management
- Transportation in the form of bus passes
- Supplemental medical (assistance with medications, glasses) and dental care
- Clothing, personal supplies, household items, and household furnishings
- Counseling (individual & group)
- Life skills workshops
- Spiritual growth and development
